

RESOLUTION I

Appointment to Federal Water Pollution Advisory Control Board

WHEREAS, the Federal Water Pollution Advisory Control Board, has not had any member with special competence in public health interests in water pollution control,

WHEREAS, the arid southwest has its great needs to conserve and reuse its limited water resources,

WHEREAS, the Chief Sanitary Engineer of the Arizona State Department of Health, Mr. George W. Marx, has for 25 years, exerted and continues to effect imaginative leadership and professional skill in solving problems of water pollution in the entire Colorado River Basin,

THEREFORE, be it resolved, that the Arizona Public Health Association recommend to President Lyndon B. Johnson that Mr. Marx be appointed to the Advisory Control Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be transmitted to the President; to the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Anthony Celebrezze; to the Assistant Secretary, James Guigley; to the Surgeon General, Luther Terry; to all members of the Arizona Delegation to the United States Congress.
